### Director's Desk

How do you feel about roller coasters? For us, before we get on one, we're positively terrified. The palms have a cold sweat, butterflies in the stomach and the mouth feels dry. This grows when it starts and when it goes uphill the palpitation builds, before the adrenaline rush of hurtling down at a break-neck speed hits.

The past year felt something like that - the fear brought on by the devastation and loss of the Delta variant, team members falling sick, the relief of the vaccine, not having access to children and finally, at long last, us being able to resume work with children in person.

With all these challenges came some lessons. One was the power of community, the knowledge that we are not alone, the impact of likeminded people and organisations coming together for child protection and the steadfast support from our advisors and donors who stood by us through this time and kept us on our feet. This enabled us to carry on doing the work we love doing, seeking opportunities and partnerships to work for children in any capacity and ready to jump into the field at any chance available. Another lesson was that of adaptability and innovation, these two years made us reflect on our programmes, upgrade it and include more digital content.

We also focused more on deeper mental health interventions and tied up with organisations to provide support to survivors who were dealing with both - the trauma of the assault and the pressures of being in an often gruelling legal system.

We learnt the lesson of patience, remembering that working in this space will come with its challenges and the pandemic was just one of them, albeit a pretty unique one. Childline India Foundation reported a 50% increase in the number of distress calls for abuse within the first 10 days of the lockdown being announced. There are global concerns of children being among the most drastically impacted population during the pandemic and the fear that many of them were potentially in lockdown with their perpetrators and perhaps unable to access help and support.

To keep from feeling overwhelmed, we held ourselves closer to the reason we want to fight child sexual abuse and create a society for safer and happier children. Patience taught us to wait and as things started re-open, we were more determined than ever to imbibe these lessons into action and continue the fight for child protection from sexual violence.







#### ADULT'S PROGRAMMES

Rubaroo recognises that preventing child sexual abuse is fundamentally an adult responsibility, therefore, apart from working with children directly, Rubaroo also works with adult stakeholders, including but not limited to parents, teachers, and school leaders. The programmes we offer are:

- Child Sexual Abuse Awareness Programme
  - For Parents, Caregivers and Adults
- Teacher Training Programme
  - o For Teachers, Leaders, Social Workers
- Customised Programmes
  - For Post Graduate Students, Judges, Prosecutors, etc.

**Objective**: To sensitize adult stakeholders and build empathy to enable them to recognize signs of distress in children and handle crisis situations.





# Counselling


Rubaroo provides counseling services to alleviate the trauma of child sexual abuse and help the victims/survivors of abuse and their family members heal psychologically.



To measure the outcomes of our CSA programmes, we conduct a baseline and endline survey with our participants.


These surveys contain simple yes and no answer-type questions that help us gauge the knowledge levels of the attendees before and after our session. The shift in knowledge is the outcome.

For each of our programmes, we have various broad indicators.


We measure these indicators with the help of the responses

we get on our baseline and endline survey.


# My Body, My Safety (Std. 8 and above)



% of children who can identify private body parts (went up from 59% to 85%)




% of children who could identify unsafe feelings (went up from 35% to 56%)




% of students who were able to identify myths and taboos associated with masturbation (went up from 34% to 56%)


# My Body, My Safety (Std. 5 - 7)



% of students who understood that if their body boundaries are being violated they should say 'no' and run away (went up from 66% to 81%)




% of students who were able to identify myths and taboos associated with menstruation (went up from 22% to 81%)




% of students who understood all people are equal (went up from 72% to 97%)

# My Body, My Safety (Std. 3 and 4)




For std. 3 and 4 children, we conduct only the endline survey.


## CSA Awareness Programme (Parents/Caregivers/Adults)



% adults who could identify the signs of CSA (went up from 55% to 66%)




% of adults who understood that children should be empowered by providing appropriate language (went up from 79% to 86%)




% of adults who could identify senstive handling of disclosure (went up from 61% to 72%)


# Teachers Training Programme



# Going the Extra Mile to Safeguard Children

- We held our first programme with a school in Karnataka in 2018-19. Back then, due to the language barrier (all the children were primarily Kannada-speaking), we were able to execute our individual sessions only with the help of a teacher of their school, who was present during the sessions to translate.
- We realised that because their school teacher was present during the sessions, the children were hesitant to open up, making these sessions less effective.
- When we were asked to do a programme again with this school in 2021, our team developed an extensive English to Kannada verbatim script which helped us conduct individual sessions without the support of any other teacher present.

**Result**: Children felt safer while talking to our facilitator and were more open during these interactions.



# Overcoming Roadblocks

- A key part of our programmes with older children is the Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) module. An organisation that was keen on doing our programmes with their children was very hesitant to include this particular module, which led to frequent delays and debates over the cancellation of the programme.
- We successfully negotiated with the organisation to arrange for a dialogue between us, the parents and the teachers. Bringing all the adult stakeholders together created a space for understanding and sensitisation keeping in mind the needs of children. The adults realised the importance of SRH education, and how it contributes to child safety by making children aware of their rights and physical well-being. They also understood the importance of educating children on cyber-safety in this digital age.

**Result**: We were permitted to do our programmes with the 134 children, with the buy-in of the adult stakeholders.






# Way Forward
